What is a Pinched Nerve?

The term of pinched nerve is used to describe any peripheral nerve that is being compressed. The peripheral nerves are located in the limbs, joints, and in the hips. Any number of issues can lead to pressure on an important nerve. This manifests as irritating and painful symptoms that usual extend down the arm or into the feet. If a major nerve comes under pressure from a serious issues, it can interfere with the use of the affected area, especially when complete numbness is involved.

Pinched Nerve Symptoms

A host of confusing symptoms can pop up when you have a pinched never. These issues may include:

- Shooting pain that radiates down a limb
- Numbness & tingling in the hands, feet, or other body parts
- Loss of reflex or reaction
- Weakness
- Atrophy in the muscles if the condition continues for years
- Loss of coordination and fine movement control in hands and feet
- Pain in the area of the nerve or in a completely different area

A nerve in the shoulder could make the chest or fingertips hurt. It can be tricky to find the exact nerve leading to the pain, but our diagnostic tools in New Haven can help.

Cause of Pinched Nerves

Some pinched nerves occur as a complete accident when you're trying to stretch for something, but others are the body's reaction to repetitive movement. You may have a common cause like:

- Bulging or Herniated disc
- Dysfunction of the cervical spine
- Ligament and tendon misalignment, which brings pressure down on the nerve
- Tennis elbow or <u>Carpal Tunnel Syndrome</u>
- Scarring of the nerve tissue due to illness or injury
- Fractures, sprains and other injuries that cause inflammation around nerves

Pinched Nerve Risks

This kind of compression can interfere with the function of a major nerve root. A badly pinched nerve may require treatment within a few days or you could develop complications like:

- Swelling of the nerve and surrounding tissue due to fluid build up
- Worsening pain and other symptoms
- Permanent pain due to scarring and damage
- Numbness that can't be completely eliminated
